<p><b>In what ways is your local neighbourhood currently not "circular"?</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Construction waste</li> <li>Supermarkets</li> <li>Cannot source local produce/crafts</li> <li>Supermarkets using single use plastic</li> <li>lack of local food markets</li> <li>Textiles</li> <li>Recycling is limited - very specific terms/considerations of recyclable goods</li> <li>Cannot recycle electricals</li> <li>Appliances/ furniture often put in commercial waste bins on estate.</li> <li>Consumption</li> <li>Textiles</li> <li>can we draft circular economy principles into specifications for capital projects/services</li> <li>Mobile phones</li> <li>Aviation</li> <li>Plastics</li> </ul>	<p><b>What are some of the features needed to make your neighbourhood fully circular?
