
# Overview of Future Neighbourhood Partnership Board

#### Energy saving measures

- 1 Triple-glazed windows
- 2 Internal wall, floor and roof insulation (non-combustible)
- 3 Mechanical ventilation with heat recovery (MVHR)
- 4 Air source heat pump to generate clean, green energy

#### Internal improvements

- 5 New commercial-grade kitchen
- 6 New accessible bathroom
- 7 Full redecoration to create a relaxing and contemporary space

#### External improvements

- 8 New external lighting
- 9 New bi-folding door to create a greater sense of space
- 1 10 New awning to enable greater use of outside space
