To Whom It May Concern,

I write in my capacity as CEO from the Space in support of the Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea Council (RBKC) proposal for the Mayor of London Future Neighbourhoods 2030 programme.

We strongly support this application and commit to working with the Council and other local partners in the delivery of several initiatives: Cooking classes for young people and families and Upcycling project.

Following the Phase 1 application when we've partnered with the Council to develop a school uniform programme, we have now committed to deliver two other initiatives following the requests from Notting Dale residents which aim not only bring environmental benefits such as tackling food waste, building a circular economy – reuse, upcycle and provide green training opportunities; but also tackle the cost of living crisis. In our activities, we bring the financial literacy training and refer residents into the wider grants and services available.

While running these activities, we would like to open the Space as a Warm space location in Notting Dale for residents to keep warm, have a meal and receive energy and financial literacy advice.

We therefore confirm that we strongly support this application and would like to partner with the Council to support with engaging the community and residents in Notting Dale and delivering a series of initiatives/projects as listed below:

10 Cooking classes for young people and families Upcycling project: rescue goods and furniture and donate it in the community together with carpentry classes

Our organisation is a charity and has been based in Notting Dale since March 2018. We were set up in the aftermath of the Grenfell Tower Fire to support the recovery of the local community and aim to create a more resilient and sustainable neighbourhood.

We are a predominantly BAME community-led organisation run by local people who are committed to improving the area's health, building local capacity, and alleviating poverty. We serve a weekly average of 500 local residents and offer a wide range of intergenerational services including health and wellbeing, training, food support in partnership
