Highlights from last quarter:

- Heat Network Poll: 84% of residents support the new heat network (49 residents, poll now relaunched)
- 2. Section 20 Leaseholder Consultation: Notification of Intent issued, September 2022
- 3. Tender packs issued for the two main contracts to deliver the Lancaster West Renewable Heat Network:
 - Design, build, operate and maintain (DBOM) contract to be let by Notting Dale Heat for construction, operation and maintenance of the Primary Network, Air Source Heat Pump I, the Renewable Heat Store and the Renewable Boiler Room.
 - Design and Build (D&B) of secondary and tertiary heat networks in homes and blocks.
- 4. Tonkin Liu chosen as architects: to co-design with residents the appearance of the Lancaster West Renewable Heat Network.
- 5. Pre-application site visit with RBKC Planners, 26 September 2022: gained initial thoughts on the planning application. Resident co-design and wider stakeholder engagement to follow.

Notting Dale Heat

'Notting Dale Heat' is the new local energy company, which is 100% owned by the Council. It has been set up to supply heating and hot water to Lancaster West Estate.



Kensington and Chelsea Council Will still be responsible for



maintaining heating systems in each home. They will also provide customer services and send heating bills to residents. Local Energy Company -**Notting Dale Heat** Will operate and manage the equipment and pipes that supply heat to each building.

Notting Dale Heat's responsibilities

- 1. Keep the machinery and pipework for heat delivery working well
- 2. Manage the company income and budget
- 3. Attract heat network professionals to deliver excellent customer service

How will the heat network be managed?

Notting Dale Heat will have its own budget and be overseen by a management board. The board will include two residents. The

board can make operational decisions independently, to ensure smooth day-today running of the heat network.

Timeline: what comes next?





Phase I, Lancaster West Renewable Heat Network:

- Resident Evaluator training: date tbc
- Resident co-design of renewable energy centres & planning application
- 2 main procurements launched, early Autumn 2022
- Heat Supply Agreements finalised
- Final Investment Decision, March 2023: able to appoint contractors to start detailed design and construction

Phase 2, expansion into Notting Dale ward:

Outline Business Case completed and submitted to Leadership Team for approval

Setting up a local energy company:

- Finalise company Business Plan: with approval by company Board, Shareholder Committee and Leadership Team
- Establish processes and policies to enable 'Notting Dale Heat' to design, build, operate and maintain the Phase I heat network

Cross Borough Energy Masterplan:

o Kick-start new workstream: with consultancy appointed via mini-competition
