### • Background:

- Funding from GLA to deliver a Future Eco-Neighbourhood
  - Phase 1 £1.4 million to each Camden Somers Town and RBKC Notting Dale
  - Phase 2 up to £1.33 million (split between Camden and RBKC)
    - Applications Due October 2022
    - Decision Made November 2022
    - Projects to be delivered by October 2023
  - Phase 3 funding envelope TBC
    - Applications Due February 2023
    - Decision Made March 2023
    - Projects to be delivered by February 2024

- Retrofitting of homes, commercial and public buildings
- Creating a decarbonised, smart and integrated energy system
