## Future Neighbourhood 2030

- **Background:**
  - Funding from GLA to deliver a Future Eco-Neighbourhood
    - **Phase 1** – £1.4 million to each Camden Somers Town and RBKC Notting Dale
    - **Phase 2** – up to £1.33 million (split between Camden and RBKC)
      - Applications Due – October 2022
      - Decision Made – November 2022
      - Projects to be delivered by October 2023
    - **Phase 3** – funding envelope TBC
      - Applications Due – February 2023
      - Decision Made – March 2023
      - Projects to be delivered by February 2024
- **Future Neighbourhood Themes:**
  - Retrofitting of homes, commercial and public buildings
  - Creating a decarbonised, smart and integrated energy system
  - Improving air quality and creating zero emission zones
  - Climate adapted, resilient, and green neighbourhoods
  - Zero waste, circular economy
  - **(New)** Helping local communities to recover from the pandemic and be more resilient to both **climate change** and the **cost-of-living crisis**

1. Developing a long-term community-led environmental strategy to achieve our aims by 2030.
2. Implementing 30+ pioneering environmental projects, split under five key themes, to transform Notting Dale ward into an exemplar model of sustainability and innovation.

The Notting Dale Future Neighbourhoods 2030 environmental strategy, and corresponding action plan, will be co-designed and co-created in partnership with residents, local Councillors, community groups, local charity and voluntary organisations, residents' associations, faith groups, schools, businesses, and key institutions.

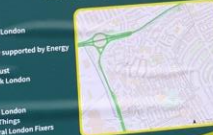

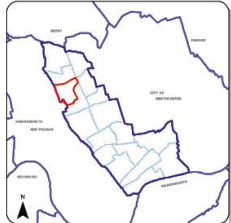

### Phase I Project Map

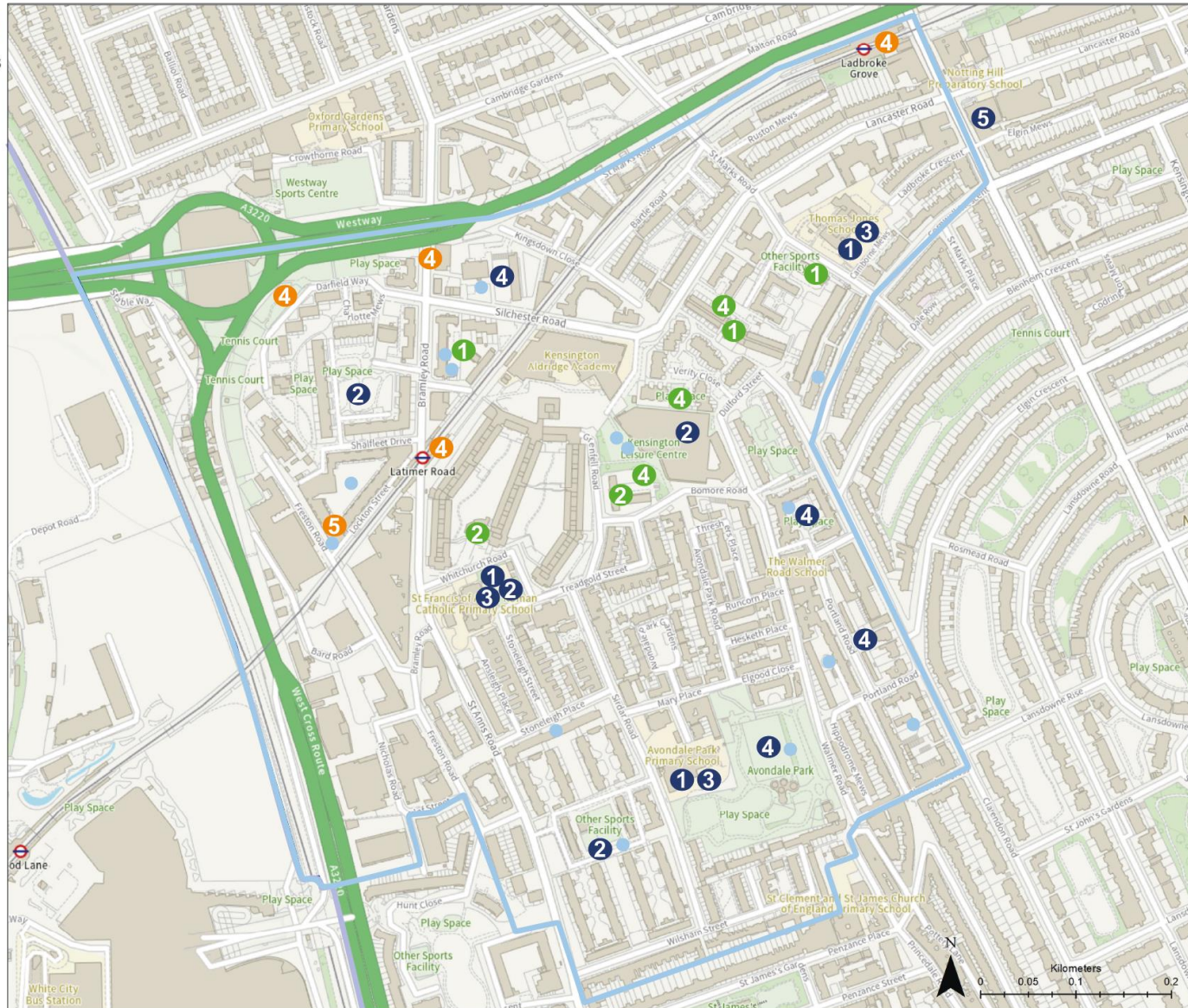


Inset map shows location of Notting Dale ward within the borough

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## Avondale Park

### Accessibility

- **Footpath improvements:** improve access around the park, safety, and drainage for users
- **Improve Seating:** new seating options for users including more disabled friendly features
- **Improve disabled accessibility:** improvements to park entrances, park layout, disabled friendly features

### Health & Wellbeing

- **New Outdoor Gym:** promoting and encouraging an active lifestyle to the community. A no-cost fitness space for those who can't afford a traditional gym membership.
- **Playground Refurbishments:** provide safe and up to date playground facilities which encourage an active lifestyle to a wider range of ages
- **Improvements to green spaces:** increase the aesthetic value of the park, along with helping to improve the public's health and wellbeing

### Sustainability

- **Renovations to the green roofs:** to improve air quality, support wildlife habitats and improving the drainage system
- **Lighting Improvements:** install new lighting columns which is wildlife friendly and focuses on lowering energy consumption and CO2 output
- **Creating more sustainable green spaces:** community garden space, vertical rain garden, nature trail etc.

### Education

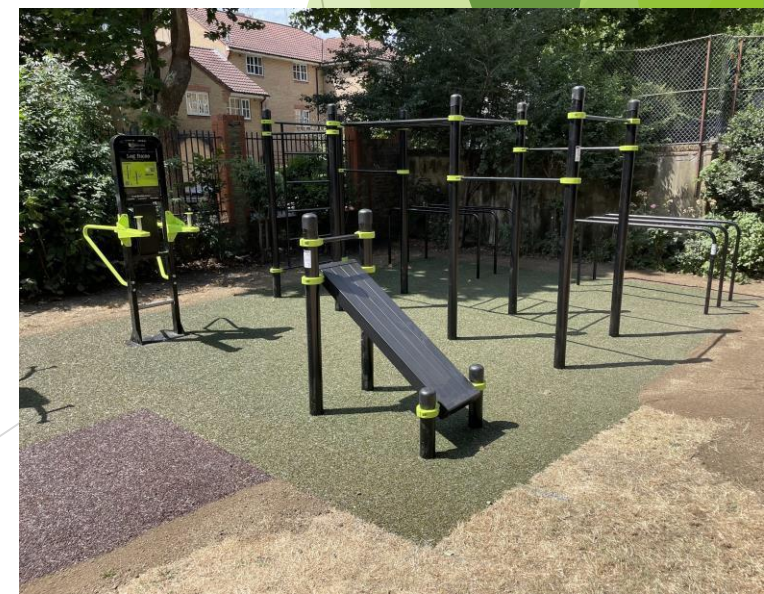
- **Signage:** history of the park/area (underground air raid shelter etc.) and wildlife awareness signage to encourage best practice and improve public knowledge
- **Volunteering:** scheme in place to encourage the community to assist with horticultural upkeep of the allocated green spaces (woodland area, sensory garden etc.)
