1.0 FUTURE NEIGHBOURHOOD PARTNERSHIP OVERVIEW

- **1.1** Hannah explained what the Future Neighbourhoods 2030 programme is and how the programme was released by the Mayor of London and GLA aiming to tackle key environmental issues in London.
- 1.2 We are currently delivering on Phase I where 30 with projects to be finished in March.
- **1.3** Currently working on a funding application for Phase 2 of the scheme and have proposed projects based on previous action plans, lists and specific suggestions from community resident associations, delivery organisations and teams across council.
- **I.4** A full qualitative analysis to understand trends and priority areas with comments being tagged to key themes. We developed the projects with community partners and internal delivery teams.

2.0 Phase 2: Proposed projects

2.1 Building a Notting Dale Nature Recovery Network:

Community Cooking and Community Kitchen Gardens: Looking at supporting local food growing and cooking to reduce costs.

Sustainable urban drainage: Delivery in Stoneleigh Place/ Street. To improve resilience against flooding.

Greening Notting Dale Ward: To increase and improve green spaces and create volunteer opportunities.

2.2 Creating a Cleaner and Healthier Notting Dale:

Active Travel Programme: Continuation of phase I project looking at cycling training, bike repairs and community led bike rides.

Air Quality Campaign Pilot: Installing monitors to measure air quality and how this changes over time. Internally and externally monitored and to use this to drive a comms engagement campaign to help protect against poor air quality and ways in which it can be improved locally.

David O'Connell: suggested to follow up on the Imperial running a cleaner air quality study in the area.

2.3 Delivering new Green Jobs and Skills in a Circular Economy:

Climate Change Awareness Campaign and Education Programme: Supporting an understanding of climate change and what we can all do, linking into the Green Skills Academy.

Community Warm Spaces Programme: Council are helping to facilitate but it will be existing community spaces in the area, looking at opening them up beyond current open times as warm spaces for residents. Also, spaces to access training offers and advice on energy bill etc.

Household Goods Redistribution and Upcycling Scheme: Taking any usable goods and furniture from properties and then expanded to taking donations to redistribute. Also giving opportunities for people to repair and upcycle these goods.

Notting Dale Community Laundrette and Refill Station: Help support people to save energy and costs associated with cleaning.

2.4 Fabric First: Notting Dale Goes Net Zero:

Henry Dickens Court Estate - Improving the Thermal Performance of Social Homes. Part of a wider programme to improve energy efficiency in these homes.

Schools Retrofit - The Route to Decarbonisation for primary schools. Continuing from a phase I project.

2.5 Powering Up for the People:

Co-designing the Notting Dale Energy Centre – part of the Notting Dale Heat Network: Providing low carbon heat across Notting Dale. Creating a visual centre for the Heat Network.

Bramley House Smart Cities: Pilot on Bramley House using smart thermostats and sensors which would help to reduce the energy use and cost within homes.

Renewable Energy in Social Housing: Looking at adding solar panels to some of the blocks.

3.0 UPDATE ON COMMUNITY PROJECTS:

3.1 Education and Economic Development

Training and Employment Hub:

Felicity Maries (LWNT) updated the Partnership Board on the Training and Employment Hub.

LWNT and LWRA have a steering group and have worked on co-designing the space, with an aim to finish at the end of October.

Key updates include:

- Installation and registration of all devices I I Dell OptiPlex Custom Devices, including creative Adobe Package (Morley)
- Works and kit out completed by end of October
- Launch event w/c 7th November
- Current live survey on GiveMyView platform (BuiltID).
