



Cumulative Reinvestment









New community projects Launched financial resilience support for residents through new Money MOT scheme

Money MOT scheme

Providing impactful, financial support for residents

This project aims to support residents to improve financial resilience, increase education, independence and ultimately, prevent the risk of homelessness.

Working with Nova, we aim to provide a holistic approach as we support residents through:

- budgeting support
- debt relief and payment plans for rent and utility arrears
- benefits calculations and assessment preparation
- support into employment including CVs, applications, interviews and managing transitioning into employment
- advocacy in appointments
- Cash First grants of up to £1000 for bills/household goods or emergency support
- · signposting to training, health, wellbeing or wraparound provisions


