

# Training and Employment Hub Background

There are **significant needs in employment and training**. Notting Dale ward, where Lancaster West Estate is located, boasts some of the highest rates of unemployment with ward data indicating that:

- ▶ 31.7% of residents are in full time employment (41% in the rest of the borough)
- ▶ 31.5% of residents have a level 4 qualifications (52.7% in the rest of the borough)
- ▶ 23.6% of the adult population with no qualifications at all

Future Neighbourhood Vision identified the **establishment of a Training and Employment Hub as a key priority** as one of the 23 projects identified following extensive research and resident consultation.




## **LWE - Goodbye Gas**

- Energy use and sustainability
- The process and delivery of the estate refurbishment

Neighbourhood Vision is a vision for community services and assets on and around Lancaster West Estate.


Through co-design, the Future Neighbourhood Vision would:
