Executive Summary

Progress towards net-zero continues through delivery of the refurbishment, the Notting Dale Heat and landscaping programmes evidenced by on site project delivery, live tenders and ongoing carbon reductions

Alongside this the climate adaptation and net-zero strategies continue to help us understand and meet our targets, and share this model with wider housing management, supporting the council's overall net-zero goals.

Workstream Summary

Carbon Emissions & Goodbye Gas

224 gas meters installed exceeding 2204/25 target, 284 induction hobs installed contributing to 11.5tCO2e a year saved through Goodbye Gas. Continued work on navigated leaseholder requirements for gas supply.

Resident Transition and Energy Advice

Tailored energy advice provided to residents supporting sustainable, affordable ways to manage energy bills. Thermal comfort pilot and innovations in metering and billing further support residents to keep bills low and effectively make use of new technologies.

Landscape & Garden Estate

Flood mitigation projects at Lower Clarendon Walk out to tender providing short term flood alleviation and long-term water storage. Further flood protection has been designed into the sitewide scheme, which has just completed RIBA Stage 2.

Climate Adaptation & Resilience

The draft climate adaptation and resilience strategy has been circulated with a focus on building in climate resilience into existing workstreams and ensuring cross-departmental understanding and targets.

Fundraising & SHDF Grant

Green Finance Fund loan has been approved, SHDF awaiting confirmation from DESNZ on potential extension of the grant funding period. LWE incorporated into HRA business planning.



Gas removal, solar PV, and the transition to electrical vehicles contribute most to emissions reductions. 3216tCO2e total emissions in FY 2023/4, a reduction of 213tCOe since 2022/3.



Scope I emissions are direct emissions produced by an organisation's business activities.

Scope 2 emissions are emissions from the production of energy that an organisation purchases.

Scope 3 emissions refer to all other indirect emissions that occur in an organisation's value chain.





Fundraising

MEEF

£10.5m loan secured via MEEF at 3.5% for Notting Dale Heat Network.
