Community Impact: Driving change through the LWE refurbishment programme Recent achievements: Financial Year 2024 - 2025

£750k secured in external grant funding for the Green Skills Academy and Circular Economy initiatives, supporting residents with the transition to low-carbon technologies, enabling more green training linked to jobs, and developing support for greener living.

7k of social value through Council contractors delivered, of £1.75m worth of commitments secured for future delivery.

23 residents into employment

local jobs brokered and created with Council contractors

£1.8m of internal investment achieved in this financial year, with local employment via LancWest Works achieving £888k, and exceeding our £6m programme-to-date target by £800k.

£47.4k savings made for residents through tenancy sustainment support, accessing wraparound services such as the Money MOT and cost of living support, totalling £95.7k since January 2023.

Respite Holiday programmes highlight Financial year (April 2024- March 2025)

294 North Kensington residents took part in the programme – of these,
73 were Lancaster West residents

38 of the 78 North Kensington households who attended any of the **43 the trips and activities provided for FREE** in the holidays completed the feedback forms. Of these:



89% of residents who filled in the feedback survey felt that accessing these activities helped relieve financial pressure this half term.



8% of residents who filled in feedback survey, rated the trips/ activities 5/5.



89% of residents who filled in the feedback survey felt that participating in these trips/ activities had a positive impact on their and their families' health and wellbeing.










Winners of Pineapple Award for Strategy 2025!



We were absolutely delighted to be recognised for our work in collaboration with the Lancaster West Residents' Association at the (now International!) Pineapple Awards again this year, established to celebrate innovation and achievements across the design and the built environment, within place-making and sustainability.



Following three wins in 2023 and 2024, this year we were recognised for the Strategy award. This win celebrates our strategy for LWE, in the context of the Grenfell Tragedy, and how it balances big ambitions and a clear vision alongside a commitment to provide a high-quality service addressing the everyday challenges faced by the community. Judges said it was adaptive, responsive and an iterative approach, with the approach allowing evolution, and appreciated emphasis on finding ways to co-design the retrofit programme with residents, and the emphasis on using it to deliver social value and green skills.

The judges "hope to see this inclusive approach to delivering ambitious policy objectives in partnership with the community replicated elsewhere."
